What is S.O.A.R.?



S.O.A.R. is a registered, non-profit, charitable society in the Province of Nova Scotia whose mandate is to provide peer counseling and support services to adults (both female and male) impacted by childhood sexual abuse and to provide public education about the effects of childhood sexual abuse.

S.O.A.R. was established in 1993. The society has come a long way in development over the past 25 years. The society began with 13 female peer counsellors and within two years had expanded their services to include all genders in Nova Scotia. The society has received several grants from the five Health Board within the Annapolis Valley. Over the years, S.O.A.R. has received awards from numerous sources, such as, the Nova Scotia Department of Health and Wellness MICA award (Meaningful Involvement of Consumers Awards), Doctors of Nova Scotia, recognition at the Nova Scotia Legislature, and presented at a national mental health and addictions form.

The mandate includes four components, (1) provide one-to-one peer support and counseling, (2) train co-facilitators to co-facilitate support groups, (3) to have a Train-the-Trainer program and (4) provide awareness and education regarding the impact of childhood sexual abuse.

MIKE LEW



M.Ed., a psychotherapist and group therapy leader, and Co-Director of The Next Step Counseling and Training Center.

As a cultural anthropologist specializing in the field of Culture and Personality

(Psychological Anthropology), Mike worked with the late Margaret Mead and Colin Turnbull. After further training in Counseling Psychology, he became a leading expert on recovery from sexual child abuse, particularly issues of male survivors.

Mike has worked with thousands of men and women in their healing from the effects of childhood sexual abuse, rape, physical violence, emotional abuse and neglect. The development of strategies for recovery from incest and other abuse, particularly for men, has been a major focus of his work as a counselor and group leader. He works with both the survivors and their partners and families.

Mike taught at The City College of New York, Quinnipiac College, The College of New Rochelle and the University of California at Santa Cruz. Now he conducts public lectures, workshops for survivors, and trainings and consultations for mental health, medical, human service, clergy, law enforcement and other professionals throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, Australia, New Zealand, Africa and Asia.

Mike's publications include *Victims No Longer: The Classic Guide for Men Recovering from Sexual Child Abuse* (Second Edition, Revised and Updated Quill, 2004) and *Leaping Upon the Mountains* (Small Wonder Books and North Atlantic Books, 1999).

Mike has even been a part of the editorial board of the Journal of Child Sexual Abuse and the review board of the Journal of Interpersonal Violence.
